SUPPLEMENTARY REGULATIONS

1. The North Humberside Motor Club Ltd. will organise a Restricted Permit Single Venue Stage Rally on the 5th August, 1984 at Alamein Barracks, Driffeld, M.R. 106/001561. The event will be sponsored by Alex E. Carr (Engineers) Ltd., Hull.

2. The Meeting will be governed by the General Regulations of the RAC Motorsports Association Ltd., (incorporating the provisions of the International Sporting Code of the FISA), these Supplementary Regulations and any written instructions that the organising club may issue for the event.

3. RACMSA Permit No. Z 0508/1 has been issued for the event.

4. The event is open to:

- (a) All fully elected members of the organising Club.
- (b) Members of the Association of Northern Car Clubs.

5. All competitors (and drivers) must produce a valid Competition Licence, Club Membership and Advertising Permit where appropriate. In addition they must also give details of their Insurance Company.

6. The event is a round of the following Championships:
N.H.M.C. Stage Rally
A.N.C.C. Stage Rally

7. The programme of the meeting will be:

Scrutineering to comply with RACMSA Technical Regulations will take place on the morning of the event. Individual times of scrutineering will be notified in the final instructions.

Any competitor not signed on by 30 mins. before his due start time may be excluded.

First car starts 8.00 a.m.

8. Cars will start at 30 and 60 second intervals.

The event will finish at the barracks, although the awards presentation will be at the Theatre Bar, Cranswick after the event. M.R. 106/025524.

The event will contain at least 8 special stages with a mileage of at least 40 miles. These stages will be timed to an accuracy of less than one minute in accordance with L4.10.10. These stages will be run on old air-field perimeter tracks which are broken up tarmac, concrete and loose chalk tracks.

9. The event will consist of ^{four}~~three~~ classes as follows:

Class 1 All cars up to 1300cc
Class 2 All cars from 1301 to 1600cc
Class 3 All cars from 1601cc to 2000cc
Class 4 All cars over 2001cc including
all cars with Twin Cam or BDA engines.

- (a) All vehicles must comply with RACMSA Technical Regulations.
- (b) All cars competing in Special Stage Rallies including single venue events must be taxed and insured for the public highways.

10. Awards will be presented as follows: —

1st Overall The Holderness Trophy and Two Replicas
plus £35.00 Cash
2nd Overall The Rosedale Trophy and Two Replicas
plus £20.00 Cash
3rd Overall The Booth Trophy and Two Replicas
plus £15.00 Cash
1st in Each Class £10 plus an Award
2nd in Each Class an Award
1st N.H.M.C. Competitor The Alex E. Carr (Engineers) Ltd. Award
1st Mixed Crew an Award
1st Novice in Each Class an Award

All named trophies to be returned within eleven months or before the date of next year's event to the Secretary of the Meeting.

No Competitor may win more than one Award.

A Novice is as defined in L1.14.4.

Note: To be eligible for 1st N.H.M.C. Award competitors must have been a club member for 3 months.

11. The entry list opens on publication of these Regulations and closes finally on 11th August. The entry fee is £29.50.

All entries must be made on the official entry form and accompanied by the appropriate fee.

13. The maximum entry for the meeting is 60 plus 15 reserves.

The minimum is 40

The maximum for each class is left open.

The minimum for each class is 5.

Should any of the above figures not be reached the organisers have the right to either cancel the meeting or amalgamate classes as necessary. The entry fee will be £29.50 and cheques/postal orders etc. should be made payable to "HOLDERNESS TROPHY RALLY". Post-dated cheques will not be accepted.

Entries will be selected as follows:—

These will be allocated in order of receipt, except for 20 to be allocated at the organisers discretion.

Entry fees may be refunded if cancellation is receiving in writing by the Entries Secretary before 28th July. After this date refunds will be made at the organisers discretion subject to the place being filled by a reserve. (All refunds will be less a £2 administration fee).

15. Provision Results will be published in accordance with L1.14.6 (a) as soon as possible after the end of the event.

16. Any protest must be lodged in accordance with L1.14.7.

17. Entrants will be supplied with a Road Book/Route Card/Time Card/'O.K.' Card/Red Cross Card/Damage Report Form at signing on.

Details of Special Stages will be issued at signing on, these documents will provide all the information necessary to enable competitors to comply with L4.3.3. and L4.6.8.

The Route will be defined by arrows. A sketch map of the stages will be provided for competitor's convenience.

PLEASE NOTE—If there are any differences between the two, the Arrowed route is the correct one.

Competitors may be required to make up lateness at the rest halt.

Servicing will only be permitted in the allocated area.

18. Competitors will be identified by Black Numbers (these will be on sale at signing on) and Rally Plates supplied by the organisers.

19. Marking and penalties will be as printed in the appropriate section of the RACMSA General Regulations except as modified below:

L4.4.5 Cars will start in numerical order from the seeded list.

L4.10.20 A competitor will be deemed not to have visited a control if he is more than 15 minutes late.

L4.10.24 Competitors are required to reduce their lateness at official halts.

20. All other General Regulations of the RACMSA apply as written except for the following which are modified:

L4.10.8 Special Stages will be timed to the preceding whole second.

L4.13.1 To be classified as a finisher a competitor must complete all Stages and visit all time controls within his maximum lateness.

L4.13.5 is modified as follows:

(a) Not reporting at a Main Time Control within 15 minutes of due time Exclusion

(b) Exclusion.

(c)&(d) Exclusion.

(e) Maximum time for stage.

(f)&(g) Maximum time for stage.

(h) Plus 30 seconds.

(i) Not applicable.

(j) Short Cutting on a Stage 1st Offence—30 Seconds
2nd Offence—60 Seconds
3rd Offence—Exclusion

- (k) For each Second taken to complete a special stage 1 second
Minimum time for stage Bogey time for stage
Maximum time for stage Bogey time plus 10 minutes
- (l) Arriving at or departing from a main time control before due time 2 minutes per minute early
- (m) Not applicable.
- (n) Not applicable.
- (o) Exclusion.
- (p) Not applicable.
- (q/r/s) Exclusion.
- (t) Not applicable.
- (u) Exclusion.
- (v) As written.
- (w) As written.

Additionally a penalty of Exclusion will be applied for the following offences:

- (a) Driving in the reverse direction on a special stage.
- (b) Smoking on a special stage.
- (c) Failing to wear an approved crash helmet whilst competing on a special stage.
- (d) Failure to comply with the regulation for which no penalty is specified.
- (e) Misuse of Red Cross Card or 'O.K.' Card.

21. Controls will be Time Controls, Special Stage Starts and Special Stage Finishes.

There will be no penalties for reporting after Schedule time at Time Controls and Special Stage Starts except for exceeding maximum lateness. The scheduled arrival time of the first car at all relevant controls will be given in the Route Card.

22. All official sign boards and arrows are mandatory.

23. Should controversy arise over a Section, the organisers reserve the right "Force Majeure" notwithstanding, to cancel the section from the results if they deem it fairer to do so.

All official times and mileages are deemed to be correct and are not subject to protest. It is the competitors responsibility to obtain a marshal's signature and a correct time at all time controls.

24. The 1984 General Regulations change the provisions relating to Judges of Fact.

"Under GR F11.2 and L4.8.1 the following facts will be Judged by officials as specified"

Failure to comply with L4.6.2 and L4.6.4 all Stage Marshals and all officials
False starts on a stage—all stage start officials
Failure to comply with L4.6.3—all stage finish officials
Unauthorised possession of pace notes—all marshals and officials
Unauthorised servicing—all marshals and all officials
Unauthorised smoking—all stage marshals and all officials
Noise (measured by a meter)—noise test marshals
Crash helmet and seat belt regulations—all marshals and all officials
Misuse of the Red Cross Card—all marshals and all officials
Depositing of litter—all marshals and all officials

NOTE: The depositing of litter by a service vehicle will result in the exclusion of the associated competing car.

25. Medical Assistance

All vehicles must carry a Red Cross Card. In the event of an accident where urgent medical assistance is required the card should be displayed to the following competitors. All vehicles will also carry an O.K. card separate from the Red Cross Card. In the event of an incidence where medical assistance is not required the O.K. card should be displayed. A Competitor seeing either a Red Cross Card or an O.K. card displayed should report the facts to the stage finish control. The penalty for displaying the Red Cross Card when urgent medical assistance is not required is EXCLUSION as detailed in SR 20(e).

26. Pace Notes

The possession of pace notes as defined in L4.6.6 by any competitor during the course of the rally whether or not they relate to the stages being used in the rally is not allowed.

27. Servicing

Servicing is defined as worked carried out on the car by any person other than the competing crew, or the use of any parts or tools not carried in the competing car. There will be one service area where work may be carried out by the service crew of the competing car.

Crews may work unassisted on their own cars in "No Service Areas" except:—

- 1) within 100 metres of any control
- 2) in any Parc Ferme

The only work permitted in these areas is to carry out the following work unassisted:—

- a) replace a wheel with a flat tyre for a wheel and tyre carried in the competing car
- b) clean lamp glasses, windscreens, windows and identification markings

Service vehicles may not use any area other than the official service area.

28. Final Instructions will be posted to competitors on or before Monday, 30th July, 1984. They have the same force as the General Regulations of the RACMSA and these Supplementary Regulations, see para. 2.

Information for Competitors

Competitors are reminded that all vehicles must be taxed and insured for use on the public highway.

All vehicles must pass the noise check, limit 84 dBA before they will be allowed to start the event.

Due to the event taking part on MOD property, no Spectators will be allowed, competitors will only be allowed one service vehicle and all persons will require a pass to enter the barracks. A maximum of 4 persons per Service Vehicle.

Service Vehicles will not be permitted on to stages. In the event of a vehicle breaking down the organisers have made arrangements for the car to be returned to the service area, WHEN THE STAGE HAS CLOSED.

The Organisers reserve the right to cancel the event should the MOD withdraw permission for use of venue.

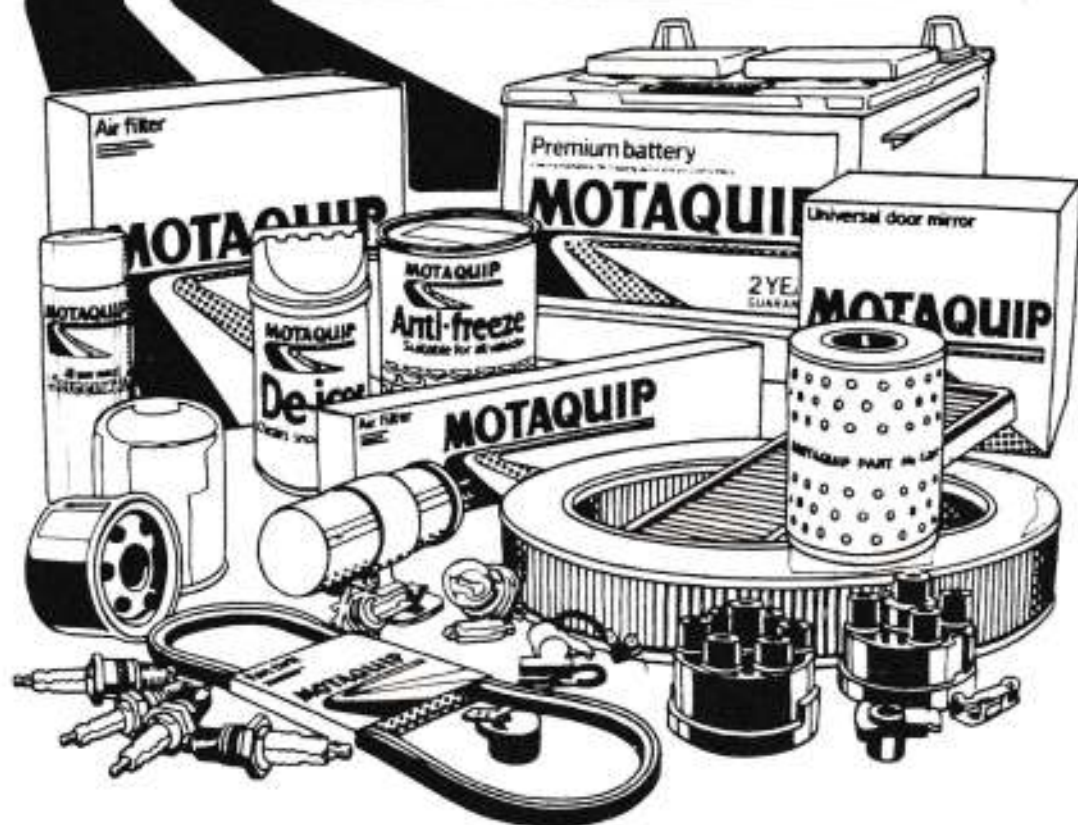
